MAKING OPPORTUNITIES TO SHARE THE GOSPEL Over Easter



Invite for food in your house.

Seeing the deco of your house says a lot about you. What's on your shelves or walls? Do they want to put ideas or questions in their minds?

What's on the table?

- Christmas crackers that have a joke but also a deeper questions / discussion starter inside.
- Chinese fortune cookie, but inside there will be interesting, deeper question or discussion starter.
- Tea-towel with life's questions on them.
- School of Life 'Conversation Menus' 20 Menus with 12 questions per menu, across different themes - to foster friendship and bring meals to life.

Supporting friends.

Do you have supportive friends? Why not share with them that you are performing / participating / organising a church (evangelistic) event. Some friends will want to come because it's a way to support you personally. You and your church can create a specific event where it enables you to get involved and also a good way to get his friends over.

Food with a theme: For those who like to have a themed party or dress up dinners.

Place or create 'conversation starters' cards on the same themes. These cards will give christians an opportunity to listen to others and explain their views. Possible themes: Ghosts, Jane Austin, Aliens, Superheroes, Victorian, etc

For example:

Halloween Night / Ghosts:

"Do you believe there is a spiritual realm?"

"What's the best ghost story you've heard?"

"Do you believe that there is life after death?"

EXTRATERRESTRIAL:

"DO YOU BELIEVE IN ALIENS?";

"DO YOU THINK SOMETHING/SOMEONE ELSE EXIST IN SPACE?"

"HOW WOULD YOU EXPLAIN THIS WORLD TO AN ALIEN?"

Jane Austin Night:

"What virtues do you seek/have in your partner?"

"Where does love originate?"

"What is love?"

"Does love have limits?"

Gifts

Give a gift of an Easter bundle/basket full of sweets, hot chocolate pack, hot cross bun and a christian book to families, friends or neighbours. You can also invite them to your church events and include a personal message with the invitation.

Organise a trip to the...

Cinema, theatre, show, concert or gallery.

And be purposeful when talking about the topics and themes that are naturally addressed in the drama / art, and have the opportunity to talk about deeper things.

Games Night.

Friends coming round to play games.

During the evening you can play one round of something like: 'The School of Life' - 100 Questions: Original Edition, or other similar games.

- 100 Questions (extra additions)
- Games for Grown-ups (School of Life)
- Therapy Game. (School of Life)



Share on social media publicly.

Join Greenhouse. Post something online: a video about your testimony, a short story, poetry, a piece of art, a personal post about your feelings or thoughts.

Community

Why not join a (secular) society or volunteer and pray for opportunities?

- Join your local library and Council community groups. Help at a food bank, CAP, or other charities.
- Help teach Welsh or English to refugees or minority groups.
- Join clubs that you naturally enjoy (group for young mums, swimming, music, badminton, workplace groups, Merched y Wawr).
- Join 'pick up litter' groups.



Intimate Easter Egg Hunt

Invite friends and their families to take part in a small Easter Egg Hunt in your garden. The prize at the end is a kids Easter activity book (Bible Society or Scripture Union). For older kids you could create harder questions or puzzles.

Blossom Watch.

Organise a walk to view different Blossom Trees in your area. Is there a beautiful park or gardens in your area, that might show spring well, and display God's handiwork of bringing growth and flowers to nature once again.



Is there a lack of community around you?

Can you create it?

- Create a neighbours/street facebook or Whattapp group.
- Ask for help from your neighbours (instead of church connections).
- Sharing seeds or cuttings from your garden.
- Create and start a reading club, exercise club, walking club, music, craft or art club, whatever your natural abilities lie.
